# What is CBIC?

#### Mission:

 To protect the public through the development, administration and promotion of an accredited certification in infection prevention and control. CBIC maintains and promotes professional certification of the highest quality through the accomplishment of key objectives.

# **Objectives of Certification**

- Provide a standardized measurement

# **Method of Certification**

- Initial certification: proctored computer-based test (CBT)
  - Remains valid for 5 years



# **Methods of Re-certification**

Proctored computer-based test (CBT)

#### **OR**

 Self-Achievement Recertification Exam (SARE)

\*\*Remains valid for 5 years



# **Certification Examinations**

- Comprehensive, job-related, objective tests
- 150 multiple choice questions;
- Developed from a practice analysis in the U.S., Canada
- Recognized by APIC and IPAC-Canada as the standard



# Self-Achievement Recertification Examination (SARE)

- Self-administered (non-proctored), internetbased from any location.
- Similar in content to the Computer-Based Test (follows content outline)
  - 150 multiple choice items developed from the practice analysis; 15 questions under evaluation, not included in scoring



# Validity of the Certification Examinations

- Developed under the guidance of a psychometrician and test development specialist from an independent testing agency.
- Each test item (question) undergoes expert and statistical scrutiny.

# **Test Questions**
