## Background.

\* Cleaning and disinfection has become one of the major issues in preventing spread of pathogenic microorganisms in the environment in hospitals and thereby prevention of nosocomial infections.

### Aim of the study.

- \* The aim of this study was to clarify how cleaning and disinfection was organized and controlled in hospitals in Europe.
- \* This was done by a questionnaire which also included questions about how cleaning and disinfection was done in practice.

#### Comments to Q1 - Q3 standards.

- \* Only 2/3 of the European countries have national guidelines or standards.
- \* Few countries include IT equipment in their guidelines.
- \* Less than 75% of the countries include rules for outsourcing of cleaning and disinfection, education of cleaning staff and what is cleaning staff and what is nursing staff responsible for cleaning and disinfection.

#### Comments to Q1 – Q3 standards.

- High risk contact points was included in less of 75% of the guidelines.
- \* Thus, there are room for improvement both concerning making national guidelines or standards and on the items that could/should be included in the guidelines/standards.

# Comments to Q7-Q11 disinfection practice.

- \* The majority of countries were using disinfection of patient rooms after use and in some areas during use. It may be a little surprising that only 30% used disinfection before protection isolation.
- \* There was great agreement on disinfection equipment after use, whereas some did it during use and few did it before use.
- \* A question that could be raised is disinfection necessary in all these cases or is cleaning well enough?

# Comments to Q7-Q11 disinfection practice.

- \* Only cloth with disinfectants are used in more than 40% of the countries. Simultaneous use of detergent or the material of the cloth may decrease the effect of the active detergent.
- \* Oxidants and alcohols were used in more 75% of the countries but also halogens were commonly used.
- \* *C. difficile* was the only special case where more than 75% of countries used disinfection.
- \* Disinfection procedures are rather ununiformed in Europe and standards might be needed.

# Comments to Q12-Q14 control of cleaning and disinfection.

- \* More than 75% of countries used internal audit with a visual control and follow-up on results.
- \* Other methods were used in special situation or experimentally.

### Conclusion

\* Even though this study only include 14
European countries, there was a great
variability in hospitals in Europe concerning
national guidelines/standards for cleaning and
disinfection and the practice of cleaning and
disinfection.

#### What can be done in the future?

- \* 1. An European educational program to clarify evidence based practices for cleaning and disinfection could be developed.
- \* 2. National or European standards (EN standards) could be developed.
