Nurses Society for the Prevention and Control of Health care related infections is a part of Croatia Nurses organization HUMS from Croatia. In cooperation with the Croatian Chamber of Nurses, the College of North Varaždin and the General Hospital of Varaždin, the third course 1st categories and the second international course "Fundamentals of prevention and control of healthcare-associated infections" was held at the College of the North, College Center Varaždin, from February 27 to 28, 2025.

The course was held under the auspices of the Ministry of Health of the Republic of Croatia and Varaždin County. 130 nurses from Croatian hospitals participated in the course.

This course brings together top experts and enthusiasts in the field of infection prevention and control with a clear goal - to improve knowledge, share best practices and empower healthcare professionals to fight healthcare-associated infections. The two days of the course were full of dynamic presentations, discussions and concrete examples from the field.
